**5. Review, discuss and take action to purchase a 2025 Ford Interceptor SUV for Emergency Management.
Funding to come from LATCF**

A. Contract for purchase of Ford Interceptor

Judge Henington proposed getting EMS James Hutchison a new ford interceptor from the enterprise due to his current rig failing. Commissioner Ortega and Morrow offered other suggestions, getting it fixed locally and looking into a different vehicle that could possibly be more suitable. Judge Henington moved to approve the buying of a vehicle for EMS Coordinator Hutchison but while also looking into other avenues. Commissioner Morrow seconded the motion; motion passed 5-0.

**6. Review, discuss and take action regarding construction of an EMS dormitory facility in Terlingua, Texas.
Presentation by Level 5 Architecture**

A. Proposed dormitory drawings

Branson "Bo" Evans and Justin Gilmore, with Level 5 Architecture presented a proposal for the EMS dormitory facility. Judge Henington moved to approve action to proceed with the EMS dormitory facility project. Commissioner


10. Adjourn
